Victorian Natal 1857 - 1899

Natal, located in southern Africa, became a British colony in 1856. The following year, embossed postage stamps were issued in the values of 3^d, 6^d, 9^d and 1/-. This exhibit tells the story of those stamps with their uses through the Perkins Bacon and De La Rue issues till the start of the 2nd Anglo Boer War in October 1899. On each page, the issue is listed top left, and the items on the page top right.

Frame 1 1857 The first embossed stamps

These stamps are only presented in used condition, as reprints were made from the original dies and paper and can only be separated from originals by genuine postmarks. No proofs exist. Used multiples of the three higher values (6d, 9d and 1/-) exist only in a single example of each, which are all shown. Seven 3^d têtebêche pairs are known, but only 3 are in private hands, of which 2 distinct uses are in this exhibit. Only 7 mixed embossed frankings exist, of which 6 distinct uses are shown. Among them is the only recorded block of an embossed issue; a 1/- block on a front with a 9^d, which is in this exhibit.

Frame 2 1859 - 1861 Perkins Bacon no watermark 1^d, 3^d; the interim use of 1^d embossed

The Chalon issues open with the only full set of four of die proofs in private hands; the unique 1^d vertical pair CANCELLED by Perkins Bacon unrecorded by Jaffe and the unique 3^d two vertical imperf between pairs recorded only on a single cover. Embossed 1^d provisionals of 1859 (in blue and pink/buff) issued for a Chalon 1^d shortage are shown on both soldier**s'** letter and newspaper (unique examples for the 1^d pink/buff); the Salmon front is shown – a parcel front with the only recorded Natal embossed 1^d and 3^d combination.

Frame 3 The 1862 – 1867 Perkins Bacon and De La Rue 1^d, 6^d and 1/- issues

The largest recorded multiples in private hands of the 1862 6^d, 1862 1^d watermark star, 1863 1^d without watermark, 1865 1^d watermark crown CC, plus the only 1/- essays are all shown. Uses shown include **soldiers' letters**; 1/4 rate to UK via Mauritius; and 18^d rate to Canada using only 1^d stamps.

Frames 4 - 5 The 1869 - 74 overprints

The 1869 local postage overprints are the hardest to find Natal Chalon stamps. The organization of their printing on the sheet is illustrated and all but 3 (as yet undiscovered) of the 47 possible used stamps are shown; 4 of the 5 mint 1/- are shown for the first time since Ferrary; the unique 1^d se-tenant Types 2 and 3 strip of three on cover is shown; as is the only 1870 1/- black overprint on cover; the unique printers proof of the 1873 1/- overprint setting is shown as are the largest mint multiples of the 1870/3 1^d, 3^d and 6^d.

Frames 6, 7 and 8 The 1874 – 1895 Chalons, Shillings and De La Rue Design Issues

The 8 recorded essays of the De La Rue Natal issues of this period are all shown. The only recorded 1877 HALF plus ½ complete pane on DLR 1^d is shown, as are the 2 recorded 1877 ½^d provisional inverted on cover. Mixed frankings are shown of Natal stamps with Transvaal, Orange Free State, New Republic and British Inland Mail stamps of Madagascar. The 1883 new colors appendix sheet is shown through the last Victorian stamps; the exhibit ends with the 1897 proposed for Natal, but unissued, AFRICA appendix sheet.

Philatelic and Related Knowledge, Personal Study and Research

There is no handbook of Natal beyond the plating and 1869 setting studies by Mann (illustrated at the start of the 1869 issues in this exhibit) **in the London Philatelist in the 1940's** and an overview of the postmarks by Hart and co-authors published in 1977. The exhibitor has published a book (2011) & more than 25 articles on Victorian Natal stamps and their uses including an analysis of the manuscript markings on embossed stamps; censi of the recorded uses of the embossed stamps and 1869 issues of Natal on cover and the uses of Transvaal, New Republic and Madagascar British Inland Mail in mixed use with Natal stamps on cover.

Victorian Natal Synopsis

This exhibit tells the story of the stamps of Natal with their uses, from the earliest known used embossed stamps, through the Perkins Bacon and De La Rue issues till the start of the 2nd Anglo Boer War in Oct 1899. On each page the issue is listed top left, and the items on the page top right.

Frame 1. In 1857 embossed 3^d, 6^d, 9^d and 1/- stamps were issued to pay the local intra – Natal rate of postage of 3^d plus a unique Natal 3^d port fee on outgoing letters at Durban and multiples of those rates. The stamps only paid external postage to the Cape or the Orange Free State. Prepayment to the UK was only authorized in 1862 after the use of these stamps had ended. Embossed stamps are collected only used, as mint reprints were made later from the original paper and dies. Most examples on cover are the 3^d, used locally at the 3^d rate. The hardest to find used stamps of any value are multiples. Seven examples of 3^d pairs exist *tête-bêche* of which only 3 are outside of museum collections; two unique usages of those three are shown in this exhibit. Unique examples of the 6^d on cover are recorded to Europe (Germany) and to Australia. Only 3 examples of the 9^d are known on cover; the 2 in private hands are shown, as is the unique used 1/- block of four. Frame 2. In 1859 perf 14 Chalon stamps printed by Perkins Bacon (PB) were sent to the colony in 1^d and 3^d values. Only one complete set of 4 PB die proofs is recorded and shown. The 1859 PB 1^d is recorded in the single example on a soldier's letter and the unique vertical pair CANCELLED by PB, unrecorded by Jaffe, are shown. The 3^d perf 14 imperf vertically exists (see SG10a) on only a single cover shown here. No high values led to large numbers of 3^d needed to prepay overweight letters. Failure to order 1^d stamps in late 1859 led to a shortage, met by printing embossed 1^d stamps in blue and pink/buff. Usages on soldier's letter are very rare and the unique uses of the pink/buff on soldier's letter and newspaper are shown. Most recorded use of the 1^d blue embossed was on newspapers from a single correspondence to the UK. The "Salmon" cover is addressed to "Salmon" and has the only recorded combination of "salmon color" 1^d and 3^d embossed stamps. Frame 3. In 1862 a PB rough perf 6^d brown was issued; when the PB Chalon 1^d finally arrived again in Natal they were on watermark star paper. This issue is little recorded mint or on cover. The following year the 1^d stamps from the UK were the last PB issue and were perf 13 on un-watermarked paper. Large multiples exist only from a single sheet in the Mayfair find of 1925 and the largest reconstructed multiple from that sheet is shown. The 1863 6^d and 1865 1^d issues came from De La Rue on crown CC paper. In 1867 the new design De La Rue 1/- was issued, for which the 2 recorded essays are shown. Frames 4/5. Until 1869, Natal stamps could be used either for postage or revenue purpose. Separation of the finances of the post office called for stamps to be designated as only usable for postage, leading to a series of overprints with the word "Postage". The first printing of these were issued in 1869 in 5 different forms on a single sheet of 240 (20 x 12) stamps. The format was worked out by Mann in the 1940's (illustrated on pages 1 & 2 of Frame 4) and extended by this exhibitor in 2019. These first printings have the overprint low on the 1^d, high on the 3^d and 6^d and low on the 1/-. The second printing is only Type 4 (POSTAGE.) with the opposite orientation = high on 1^{d} , low on 3^{d} and 6^{d} and high on the 1/- stamp. The 1869 stamps are rarities in any kind of multiple, as is their use on cover. Not all of the types, mint or used are recorded on the 3^d perf 14 and 3^d intermediate perf. The 1/- mint first printing are recorded only in 1 - 2 copies each in private hands, with only one recorded anywhere of type 5 (shown); 4 of the 5 types are shown mint for the first time since Ferrary. Setenant stamps exist in the Royal collection, one 3^d pair in private hands and a strip of three 1^d on cover which is shown. The 1870 De La Rue 1/- exists used with trial overprints inadvertently issued in red and black (shown with the unique black overprint use on cover). The largest mint multiples of the 1870/3 De La Rue 1^d, 3^d and 6^d are shown. In 1874, a 1/- brown revenue and 1^d Chalon were also locally overprinted postage. The only recorded plate proof of the 1/- overprint is shown. Frame 6. In 1874 De La Rue issued new designs of the 1^d, 3^d, 6^d and, for the first time, a 5/- stamp. All the essays are shown, as are specimens, proofs, and mixed use of the 6^d with Transvaal stamps and the only recorded non – philatelic use of the 5/-. Finally, the 1875 1^d local overprint is shown in its largest recorded mint and used multiples. Frame 7. The 1875 local postage overprints are shown. The 1^d red is shown in a mixed use with Transvaal stamps and the 6^d on one of only 3 recorded Natal / Orange Free State mixed uses on cover. In 1877 the single letter postal rate to Europe and USA became $7 \frac{1}{2}^{d}$ and in the absence of this value, 1^d De La Rue and 1^d Chalon yellow and 6^d rose revenue stamps were overprinted 1/2^d. The De La Rue 1^d overprint HALF 1/2 of 1877 exists in 6 different forms of the 1/2 and the only recorded full pane is shown with an unrecorded gothic 1 on a single stamp. On the $\frac{1}{2}d$ yellow the se-tenant missing overprint is

shown mint and used. Both recorded inverted overprint uses on cover are shown. The rose stamps' recorded major varieties are all shown as is the use on cover with an OFS stamp. In 1878, 6^d remainders were overprinted 1^d . This stamp is rare on cover and is shown on a newspaper. In 1878 DLR issued a new 4^d for the new 4^d registration rate and in 1880, finally, a $1/2^d$ stamp was issued, for which the essays, die proofs, DLR plate proof and specimens are shown.

Frame 8. All the De La Rue 1874 – 1880 crown CC stamps, except the 5/- were re-issued in 1882 – 1889 on crown CA paper. The appendix sheet showing perf 12 stamps in new colours is shown. Further $\frac{1}{2}^{d}$ and $\frac{2}{2}^{d}$ overprints were issued in 1885/6. The $\frac{1}{2}^{d}$ is shown in its largest recorded multiple and the 2^{d} De La Rue proof and specimen are shown. The colonial keyplate 2^{d} was issued in 1888 with progressive die proofs shown; and the detached triangle mint and used on cover. In 1890 an orange revenue Chalon 1/- was overprinted by De La Rue with curved red postage overprint which is recorded used in a double print. The entry of Natal into the UPU required a $2\frac{1}{2}^{d}$ stamp issued in 1891. Accepted and unaccepted essays are shown and the largest recorded 7x multiple of the stamp in use with Madagascar British Inland Mail. Finally, in 1895 the last Victorian stamps of Natal were again $\frac{1}{2}^{d}$ overprints in response to a shortage. The $\frac{1}{2}^{d}$ overprint on 6^{d} issued on 12 March is shown used on the 2^{nd} day of use, and the 2 recorded blocks each with a single stamp missing POSTAGE (top right and top left respectively) have been re-united. The final HALF issue (18th March) is shown with a new discovery of (HAL) missing. The exhibit ends with the 1897 appendix sheet of the proposed for Natal, but unissued, AFRICA stamps.



Manuscript X undated (based on the correspondence probably from Pinetown) on têtebêche 3^d pair paying double rate to Dean of Pietermaritzburg.

Three examples of tête-bêche pairs exist in private hands and this is the only example of a tête-bêche pair on cover or front.

Only Known Example to Australia Unique Verulam "3" Cancelled Pair on Cover

All 3^d embossed covers recorded to date are addressed to Southern Africa or Europe, except this cover.

Earliest recorded use of Natal 3^d embossed stamp and only recorded 3^d embossed cover to Australia

5 Jul 1857. 3^d pays Durban port fee and postage to Cape Town. Sent by Rennie "Madagascar" to Cape Town (18 Jul transit on reverse) and "Lady Sherbourne" from Mauritius with Ship Letter Free Victoria on reverse, as Victoria had no incoming ship letter fee in 1857. Detained for advertisement with Letter Carrier LC OCa 31, 1857 date-stamp. Redirected to Castlemaine with 2^d internal Victoria postage due and Nov 19 arrival on reverse. BPSB cert. 2016 "Genuine in every respect".



Aug 1861. Unique 3^d pair recorded cancelled "3" Verulam. Rated as single 3^d internal rate plus 3^d port fee to Cape, but rated double weight 1/- due in UK. London 28th Sep 1861 arrival. BPA cert. 2003.

The Only Recorded Pair

Largest Margined 6^d On Cover Zululand to CT; PMBurg & Umzinto "7" to England

Mar 1858. Meteorological letter from Dr. Robert James Mann at Ekukangeni, Zululand, via PMBurg to Thomas Maclear at the Royal Observatory, Cape Town; Apr 20th Cape Town arrival. Mann was requested to make these observations by Sir John Herschel and Thomas Maclear (later Sir), a personal friend who also assisted David Livingstone with astronomical observations. Brandon 1988, Holcombe 1995 certs.

Eleven covers or fronts of large parcels with the embossed Natal shilling are recorded. None are in the Royal, Mann, Hurst or Tapling museum collections of Natal. Ten are in this collection (5 of them, each showing different rates, are shown).

March 1859. Double rate PMBurg to Cape Town; 19th March 1859 arrival. Endorsed and carried "Per L'Imperatrice Eugenie". RPS cert.1960. BPA cert.1998. ex Dale – Lichtenstein.

1857 Embossed Issue May & Davis PMBurg Shilling

June / July 1857. Earliest recorded use of Shilling embossed stamps on cover with mute cancels and Post Office P.M.Burg oval only recorded used together during June and July 1857. Two Shilling stamps prepay 8 times the local 3^d rate on a parcel from the well known correspondence to John Goodricke, attorney at law and Mayor of Durban the following year. 1857 Embossed Issue The Only Two Recorded Shilling + 6^d Registered Covers Quadruple (2/6) and Double (1/6) Registered Rates



2 Apr 1858. Unique quadruple franking. Charged 2/plus 6^d registration. Stamps tied PMBurg oval plus **Crown Registered and London Registered** datestamp. By Rennie "Madagascar", but missed Union "Dane", so sent by HMS "Southampton". London transit; Bolton arrival 26th May. ex Weinberger and Wilcocks. BPA cert. 1999.

7 May 1859. Unique double franking. Charged 1/plus 6^d registration - entire letter mentions three enclosures - thus double weight. Stamps also tied PMBurg oval with London Registered and Devonport Cape Packet arrival datestamps. Per Rennie "Waldensian" from Durban on 10th May then Union "Phoebe" from Cape Town arriving Devonport UK on 25th June 1859. Slightly reduced at left. Ex Hart and Besançon.

1857 Embossed Issue May & Davis PMBurg Shilling

4/9 shilling block and 9^d pay 19 times local rate of 3^d for parcel weighing over 9 ounces.

BPSB cert. "Genuine in all respects"; RPSL cert. 2019 and BPA letter advising that the stamps are genuine, but they cannot be certified as belonging to this front.

Provenance: Stocken, Stamps of Great Price, 1932, states "I consider this combination of the highest degree of rarity and I doubt the existence of any other piece of this country in any way comparable to this in interest".

Single 1/- rate carried on 12th Jun by Union "Saxon" to Cape Town and then Union "Briton" arriving Devonport on 23rd Jul 1867. Birmingham back stamp on 24th July. BPA cert 1987 as SG10 var and BPA cert 2019 as SG10a. 1859 Chalon Heads Perkins Bacon 3^d Perf 14 Early Manuscript Cancellation Earliest Recorded Use of Natal Chalon Stamps Umzinto Manuscript

Aug 9, 1859. Letter dated Springvale; pen cross cancels prior to arrival of datestamp. "Waldensian" Sep 9th to Cape Town; "Norman" to Devonport Oct 26th. 6^d packet fee due and redirected within London apparently without charge. Two Chalon 3^d pay 3^d postage to Durban and the 3^d port charge. Use of Natal stamps to prepay overseas postage was only authorized on 1 January 1862. BPA cert.1998.

1859 Chalon Heads Perkins Bacon 3^d Perf 14



Ten times 1/- rate to England franked with forty 3^d stamps. The largest recorded franking of this issue – largest multiple on the piece is a strip of 8 in the second row. 




