NEWSPAPER DUTY

FIRST ISSUE DIE 1: STAMP AT UPPER LEFT (8 December 1832)

The revenue stamp was usually applied at upper right of the document. It is speculated that the sheets of paper for this newspaper were taken for stamping prior to printing ("Stamped Paper"). The publication was printed in Cape Town so it was not a major inconvenience to carry full sheets for stamping.

Printing was on a flat-bed printing press. Newsprint as we know it was only invented in 1844 in Canada.
